

won their eighth national championship with a 1-0 win over Georgetown. Soderlund was red-shirting this season and did not play in the regular season or tournament, but was on the sideline for the national championship match. He is expected to be the starting goalkeeper next

year for the Hoosiers.

Indiana completed a miracle run through the NCAA tournament, defeating top-seeded Notre Dame and longtime rival North Carolina along the way. In the final, Nikita Kotlov scored in the 65th minute and solid goalkeeping from senior Luis Soffner made the lead stand up. Soffner's play during the season has earned him a spot at the MLS Combine early next year. Soderlund said his relationship with Soffner and two years of training with the Hoosiers has prepared him to take the starting role next year.

Indiana University

The Hoosiers advanced to the national quarterfinals on Sunday with a 2-1 win in double overtime over top-seeded Notre Dame. Notre Dame grabbed a 1-0 lead early in the second half, but Indiana equalized less than a minute later. The 1-1 scoreline stood for the remainder of regular time and through the first overtime before Eriq Zavaleta won it for the Hoosiers in the 102nd minute. Indiana advances to play ninth-seeded North Carolina on Friday at Chapel Hill, N.C. Idaho Rush sophomore goalkeeper Michael Soderlund plays for the Hoosiers, but did not play in Sunday's match.

Indiana University

The Hoosiers cruised past Xavier University 4-1 in the second round of the NCAA Div. I national tournament and will face top-seeded Notre Dame on Sunday in the Sweet 16. Indiana scored first on a goal from Nikkita Kotlov in the 18th minute. Xavier equalized before the break, but the Hoosiers banged home three goals in a 15-minute span in the second half -- including two more from Kotlov -- to bring home the win. Sophomore Idaho Rush alum **Michael Soderlund** did not appear in the game.

Walla Walla reached the finals of the NWAACC tournament before falling 1-0 to Peninsula (Wash.) College on a 88th minute goal. The Warriors reached the final by beating Highline (Wash.) Community College 3-2 on Saturday. In the final, Walla Walla used scrappy defense and solid goaltending to keep the scoresheet clean in a game played in the driving rain in Tukwila. The Clan scored in the first half and held the 1-0 lead until the 66th minute, when Grand Canyon forward Saeed Robinson equalized from the penalty spot. Northwest College

Northwest College (Powell, Wyo.) dropped its first two games of the National Junior College Athletic Association national championships, eliminating them from championhip contention. The Trappers ran into a buzzsaw in the first game, losing 4-0 to third-ranked and unbeaten Louisburg College (Louisburg, N.C.). Things got a little better Tuesday morning as the Trappers, playing on only 18 hours of rest, lost 2-0 to eighth-ranked Cincinnati State. Northwest, ranked 18th in the country, ended its season with a 17-8 record. Three former Idaho Rush players -- **Nate Hunt, Will Moats** and **Kevin Fekete**, all freshmen -- play for the Trappers.

Grand Canyon University

The 'Lopes advanced to the regional finals of the NCAA Div. II national championships in dramatic fashion, beating Cal State-Los Angeles in PKs on Saturday. Grand Canyon took the early lead on a header from Adam Finnefrock in the 21st minute, but CSLA equalized on a dramatic header from Rosario Bras with only minutes left in the match. The Eagles kept up the pressure in extra time, forcing 'Lopes goalkeeper Josh Zehring into several good saves. Neither team could find the winner, though, and the game was settled from the penalty spot.

Freshman Yared Solcheid was the only Idaho Rush alum to play in the game, although the roster

boasts five former Rush players. Yared played for about 25 minutes in the first half, about 15 minutes in the second half, and he started the first extra time period.

The 'Lopes advance to play second-ranked and top-seeded Simon Frasure University in the Sweet 16. The exact time and date of the game has not been announced. Interestingly, Simon Frasure, of Vancouver, British Columbia, became the first non-American school to win an NCAA tournament game when they beat Cal State-Stanislaus 2-1 in the second round.

The Eagles won their first Cal-Pac Conference championship in their first year of membership, rolling through the four-team tournament with a 4-0 win over Simpson University (Calif). in the semifinals and a 2-0 win over Menlo College (Calif.) in the finals.
