- College preparation.
- College athletics.
- College contact preparation.

- College research assistance.
- Admissions counseling.
- Recruiting.
- ACT/SAT guide.

The CAP is designed to serve high school-age students and provide them with an avenue to ask questions, perform research, and provide feedback for both the academic and athletic aspects of their collegiate career.
